WESTOW PARISH COUNCIL

Our parish council is the local authority in the district of Ryedale that serves the people of Westow, Firby and Kirkham. As such it is usually the first place people will go to with ideas or concerns that affect the local community. The most common topics that arise are planning matters (the parish council are statutory consultees), crime prevention, managing open spaces, campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities. Whilst the parish council has limited powers on its own to make decisions we do have the ability to negotiate with, and the power to influence, those other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the district council, health authorities, highways agency, police etc.).

Westow Parish Council has nine Councillors and a Parish clerk. Councillors are appointed for four years and can apply for re-election after that time. Individuals can also be co-opted should the need arise. The Council usually meets six times a year at Westow Village Hall and members of the public are also invited. Meetings last about two hours, depending on the agenda. All meetings are advertised on the council notice board and minutes also placed there as well as stored on the website. Residents can bring to the attention of the parish council anything that concerns them, either directly or through the clerk. If matters raised are not the responsibility of the council, the clerk can bring them to the attention of the proper authority.
